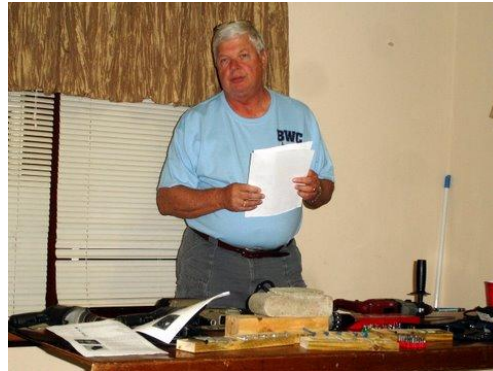
December’s program is, of course, the Holliday Party! In January, Brady has agreed to demonstrate and give us a little lesson on Google SketchUp! I’m ready!!

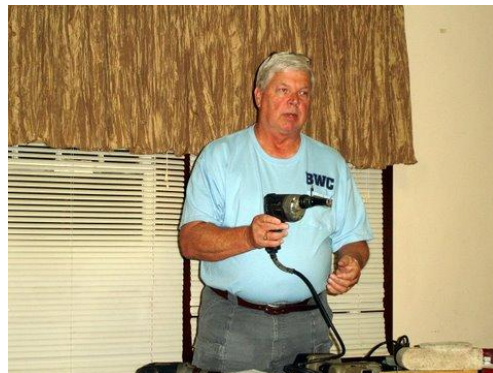

Bill has almost finished his intarsia Yorkey.



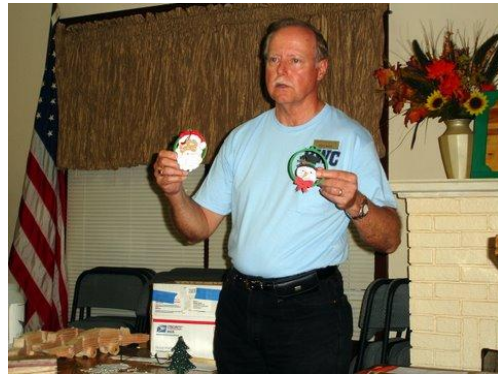

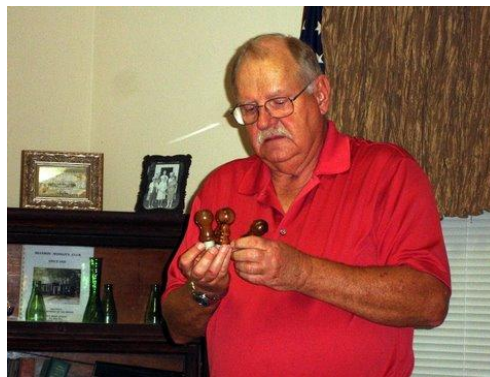
Brady donated the alligator toys he made for the 2x4 contest to the Toy collection!
